A national study based on representative samples from a population of 213 million people has shown large increase in the prevalence of hypertension in urban and rural areas in the country. The study conducted in Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Jharkhand and Chandigarh found that the prevalence of hypertension was highest in Tamil Nadu at 27.6 percent, followed by Chandigarh at 25.8 percent, Maharashtra at 25 percent and Jharkhand at 23 percent. While overall, the prevalence of hypertension was more in urban areas than in rural areas, it was clear that the rural areas are catching up rather quickly. The authors added that with India undergoing economic growth and demographic transition with increasing urbanisation, the burden is likely to increase further. They have recommended that health care systems should be strengthened for early detection and effective treatment of individuals with hypertension.
